Active duty Navy for 28 years.

Naval Staff Duty Pentagon, Washington, DC for three years. I can explain in great detail why the Pentagon is round! Great outdoor snack bar in the center. Best job ever as Commanding Officer, USS Coontz (DDG 40). We sailed in the Caribbean Sea, Mediterranean Sea and Arabian Gulf. My crew helped save the USS Stark after she was hit by two Iranian Exocet missiles.

Initial Director of Operations and Plans, Joint Task Force 4 (now 4th Fleet). We caught drug smugglers who were using air craft, boats, and semi submersible boats. Called at home by the Chief of Naval Operations to become the first Commanding Officer Naval Station New York City. Built a Navy Base including piers, housing, barracks, etc. on Staten Island.
